History

Basic Procedures

The Color Guard is formed and marched in one rank at close interval, the bearers in the center. They do not execute rear march or about face. The Color Guard marches at right shoulder arms and executes facing movements by wheeling to the right or left. The command for a facing movement is, Right (Left) wheel, MARCH. To execute a wheeling movement, the guard nearest the direction of turn serves as the pivot point and executes the movement by marching in place and simultaneously turning in the new direction. Other members shorten their steps and turn in an arc keeping abreast of each other to maintain alignment. When the movement has been completed, each member automatically marches in place until the command HALT or Forward, MARCH is given.

Color Guard: continued

During ceremonies, the Color Guards remain at right shoulder arms except when presenting arms.

The Color bearers execute at ease and rest, keeping the staffs of the Colors vertical. The Color guard executes right shoulder, order arms, and present arms. During ceremonies when the Colors are not forward and remarks are to be made, the Color guards and Color bearers execute order arms and parade rest on command of the Color Guard Commander.

Posting and Retiring the Colors

Formal assemblies conducted indoors begin with the presentation of the Colors, referred to as Posting the Colors, and end with the Retirement of the Colors. The following instructions outline the procedures for posting and retiring the Colors, with a head table. Since indoor areas vary in size, configuration, and intended purpose, these instructions do not apply to all situations. Therefore, persons planning an indoor ceremony can modify these instructions based on their specific floor plan.

Posting the Colors

The Color guard forms outside the entrance to the dining area, auditorium, or meeting hall. The audience is directed to stand until the Colors are posted. If the playing of the National Anthem (or other appropriate music) and the invocation are scheduled, the audience will remain standing until they are completed. When the arrangements include a head table, the Color guard enters in a line formation, preferably, or forms in a line immediately inside the room and moves to a position centered on and facing the head table.

When the Colors arrive at the pre-designated position, the Color sergeant commands Colors, HALT, and Present, ARMS; and reports the colors are present. The host acknowledges the report. The National Anthem is played. At completion of the Anthem the Color sergeant commands Order, ARMS; the host directs, POST THE COLORS. The area should be arranged to allow adequate space for the Color guard to move between the head table and the flag stand.

The Color sergeant then commands Right, FACE; and Forward, MARCH. On the command of execution MARCH, the Color guard marches to the rear of the head table.

Once the Color guard is centered on the flag stand, they mark time and the Color sergeant commands Colors, HALT and Right, FACE. The Color guard should approach the flag stands from the right to position the National Color bearer in front of the flag holder on the right, facing the audience. The Color bearers, without command, place the colors in the stand. When the Colors are in the stand, the Color sergeant commands Left, FACE and Forward, MARCH; and the Color guard exits the area.

Retiring the Colors

The audience is directed to stand for the retiring of the Colors.

When a head table is used, the Color sergeant moves the Color guard to the head table. The Color sergeant commands Color guard, HALT; Left Face; Present, ARMS, and reports to the host, "Sir, Request permission to retire the colors."

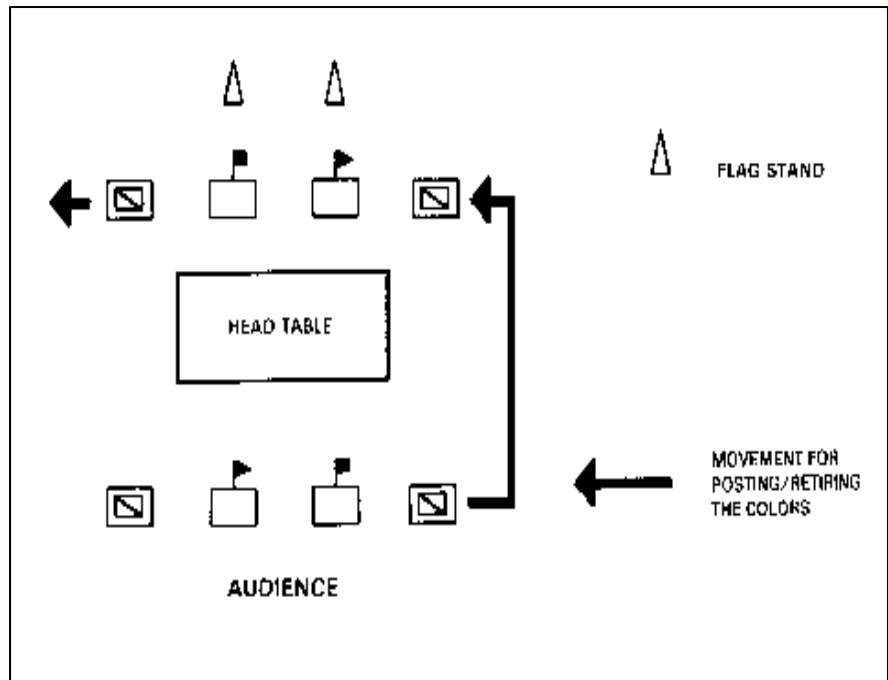
Color Guard: continued

The host acknowledges the report and directs RETIRE THE COLORS.

The Color sergeant commands Order, ARMS; Right, FACE; Forward, MARCH; and moves the Color guard until they are centered on the flag stand where they mark time.

The Color sergeant commands Color guard, HALT; Right, FACE; The color bearers, without command, retrieve the colors and assume the carry position.

(The procedures are as follows:)



The Color sergeant commands Left, FACE and Forward, MARCH. The Color guard exits the area.

NOTE: All commands are subject to interpretation and will be military in content.

FRONTIER TOWN IN GINGERBREAD

The Baltimore Metropolitan Chapter of the 9th and 10th (Horse) Cavalry Association Buffalo Soldiers took a very different approach to telling the history of these brave, tenacious and revered African American men. Our goal was to make a visual presentation of a fort, a frontier town and a Native American village out of gingerbread. The members of the chapter would be dressed in Period Uniform presenting the history of the Buffalo Soldier, tying in the relationship of the soldiers to the community that they protected, tables would be set up to display military artifacts, documents and books all supplementing the story.

This project was the brain child of Trooper Joan M. Scott-Cruise, as the gingerbread instructor, she recruited 23 students who baked 31 dwellings and 9 pieces for transportation. Trooper Cruise designed and created all of the patterns used in the display, in addition to making 11 dwellings for the fort and 5 dwellings for the town. Each student received a folder with printed materials to include a list of tools, ingredients, recipes, a paper pattern and other pertinent information at a cost of \$5.00 to cover the cost of printing. Sixteen members of the association participated.



The gingerbread frontier town was displayed at the Waxter Center for Seniors 1000 Cathedral St. Baltimore, Md. 21201 on Nov. 9th and 10th 2007 from 12 noon until 6:00PM.

The display was opened with a ribbon cutting ceremony by the centers Director Mrs. A. Butler and past National President R. Robinson. On Saturday,



a local TV station, Channel 11 did a live segment and taped 3 interviews with chapter President M. Cruise, trooper G Eldridge and trooper J. Cruise that aired on the Sat. evening and

again on the Sunday morning news as a part of the Veterans Day acknowledgements.

The presentation was EXTRADIONARE in that each dwelling housed an electric light. The buildings were constructed in various sizes and shapes. Many were painted inside and out with detailed interiors and landscaping.

All chapter members were first time gingerbread bakers and all did an excellent job in their interpretation of depicting the Old West.

The Chapter wants to send out a SALUTE to trooper Theard from Washington DC, Trooper Grady from Virginia and a 4 star salute to National Secretary Leanna Rodgers from North Carolina for traveling over the highways to see our display.

OFFICIAL APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

PURPOSE

To perpetuate the memory of comrades who have passed on and the history of the many accomplishments of the Ninth and Tenth Cavalry Regiments in defense of our country.

MEMBERSHIP IN THE ASSOCIATION shall be of four (4) types, without limit in number, open at all times to any qualified person who may apply, pay annual dues, and comply with the rules of conduct prescribed in the By-Laws, are as follows:

REGULAR MEMBERSHIP - Any person who has ever served with any unit of the Ninth and Tenth Cavalry Regiments, or Squadrons, provided such person shall continue to serve honorably or have an honorable discharge or separation from military service.

ALLIED MEMBERSHIP - Any person who has ever served with any unit of the Twenty Seventh or Twenty Eighth Cavalry Regiments, or Squadrons, or any unit whose original cadre was made up of members of the Ninth or Tenth Cavalry Regiments, provided such person shall continue to serve honorably or have an honorable discharge or separation from military service.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP - Any person who has rendered outstanding service to this Association or to the country through service in either the Armed Forces or his/her community. Such members shall have a vote on the floor after one (1) year of membership.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP - At age eighteen (18), any person who is a descendent of a **REGULAR, ALLIED, or ASSOCIATE MEMBER** is eligible for membership in the Association as an **ASSOCIATE MEMBER**.

HONORARY MEMBERSHIP - Any person who has performed distinguished service for the United States or for this Association may be accepted as an **Honorary Member**. **Honorary members** shall not pay annual dues and shall not have a vote on the floor at any time. Any person who served honorably in the War with Spain (Cuba) or the Punitive Expedition (Mexico) are automatically **Honorary Members** of this Association.

ANNUAL DUES - Annual dues are \$25.00 per year and shall be payable upon joining the Association and thereafter on the first (1st) day of January each year. Annual dues shall include membership in the Association and subscription to the official publication.
